LOCAL CONTROL FUNDING FORMULA (LCFF)

The **LCFF** is the state's funding formula for K-12 public schools. The **LCFF** establishes three categories by which school districts receive funding: *Per-Student Base, Supplemental, and Concentration Funding**RCSD does not receive Concentration Funding

LOCAL CONTROL ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN (LCAP)

The LCAP is the District's three-year plan for how it will use LCFF funding to align the district budget to accomplish both state and Board goals.

The LCAP requires school districts to identify annual goals, take action, and measure progress in the areas of academic achievement, school climate, and parent engagement.
